NOTABLE EVENTS

- On 1/23/26 at approximately 3:45 p.m., officers near the Manhattan Beach Mall were flagged down about a theft at Alo Yoga. Officers located the suspect vehicle; one suspect fled on foot while another remained inside. After a brief foot pursuit, the fleeing suspect was taken into custody, and all stolen property was recovered.
- On 1/25/26, at approximately 9:50 a.m., officers were dispatched to Ralphs (2700 N. Sepulveda Blvd.) for a shoplifting that had just occurred. Officers located the suspect who was arrested for theft two weeks prior at a different location. The suspect was arrested for burglary and outstanding warrants.
- On 1/25/26 at approximately 12:50 p.m., officers responded to a theft in progress at Target (1200 N. Sepulveda Blvd.) The suspect left the store prior to officers' arrival and was later located in the Target parking lot. Officers observed a large knife on the suspect's belt, and was later arrested without further incident.

NOTABLE EVENTS

- On 1/26/26, at approximately 11:10 a.m., officers were dispatched to BevMo (1700 Rosecrans Ave.) for a theft that just occurred. Officers located the suspect after he exiting the store without paying for goods and was arrested for shoplifting. A criminal history check revealed the suspect had two prior theft related arrests and convictions.
- On 1/28/26 at 5:26 p.m., officers responded to a robbery a Macy's (3200 N Sepulveda Boulevard). A Macy's loss prevention employee attempted to detain two female juveniles for shoplifting and became involved in a struggle, during which he was assaulted multiple times. Officers arrived to find both suspects detained by loss prevention office. Both juveniles were arrested for Robbery and transported to a juvenile detention center.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

The MBPD wants to give the following tips to prevent residents from being victims of wallet thefts.

- Carry only what you need; leave extra cards and cash at home.
- Use wallets with zippers or RFID protection.
- Keep wallets in front pockets or secured bags, not back pockets.
- Never leave wallets unattended in shopping carts, gyms, or vehicles.
- Be alert in crowded areas where pickpocketing is more common.
- Secure purses and bags with zippers closed and straps worn across the body.
- Avoid displaying cash or valuables in public.
- Regularly check that your wallet is still in your possession.
- Immediately report lost or stolen wallets and cancel cards

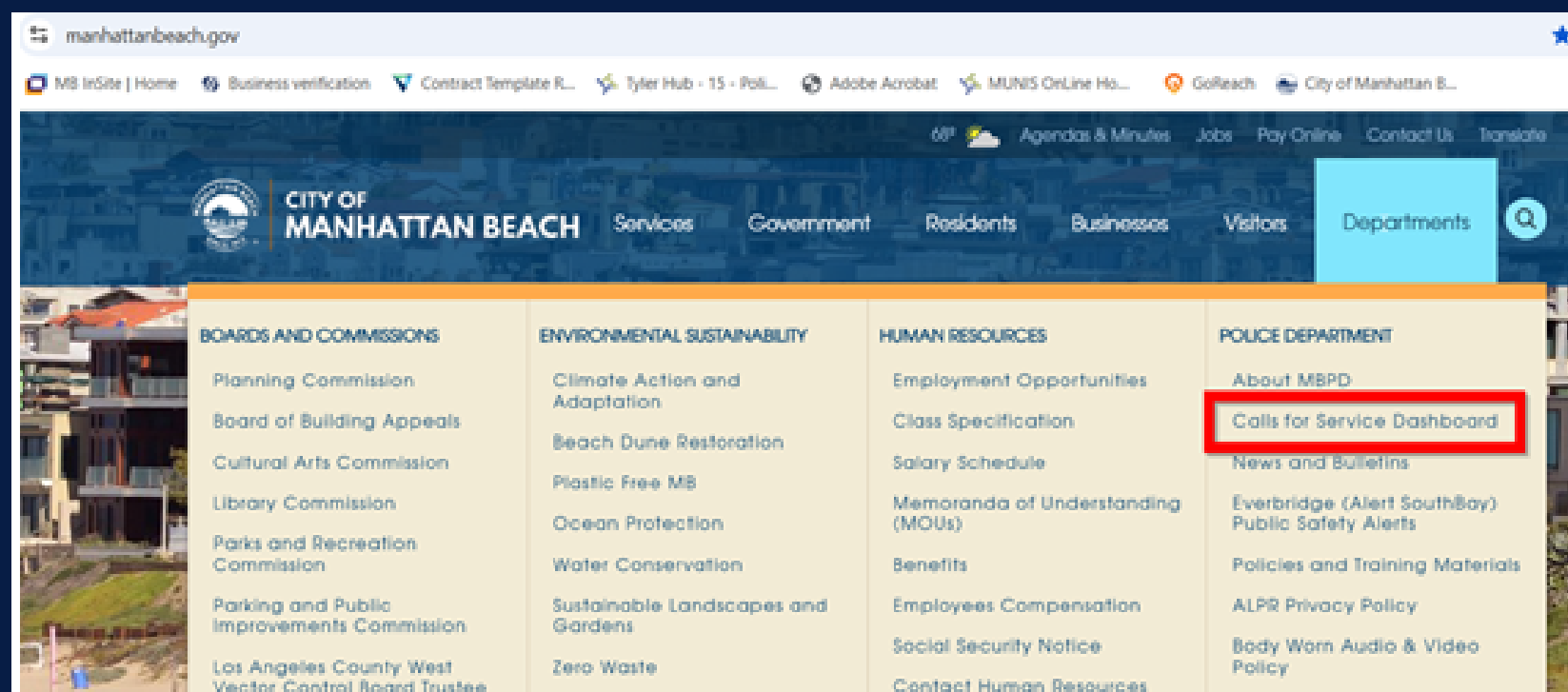
