NOTABLE EVENTS

- > On 4/11/26, at approximately 9:50 P.M., officers responded to a burglary report in the 2400 block of Blanche Road. Upon contact, officers were notified by the victim that he had left his garage door open allowing an unknown suspect to enter and steal his electric bicycle. A report was taken.
- > On 4/12/26, at approximately 1:00 P.M., officers responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance, in the 3300 block of The Strand. Upon contact it was determined three suspects gained access to a construction site and had stolen bulk copper wiring, before fleeing the area in a vehicle, a report was taken.
- > On 4/13/26, at approximately 5:00 A.M., officers responded to a burglary alarm in the 500 block of North Sepulveda Boulevard. Upon arrival, officers discovered a smashed glass door and the building appearing ransacked. It was ultimately determined two suspects gained access to the business and had stolen bulk cash from the store's cash registers, a report was taken.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

The MBPD wants to give the following tips to prevent garage theft.

- Always keep your garage door closed and locked, even when you're home—open garages are easy targets for quick thefts.
- Install motion-sensor lighting and security cameras to deter suspects and capture activity around your garage.
- Lock the interior door leading from the garage into your home to add an extra layer of security.
- Do not leave valuables (tools, bikes, electronics) in plain view—store them in locked cabinets or cover them.
- Secure your garage door opener by removing it from parked cars outside and using a smart or rolling-code opener to prevent unauthorized access.

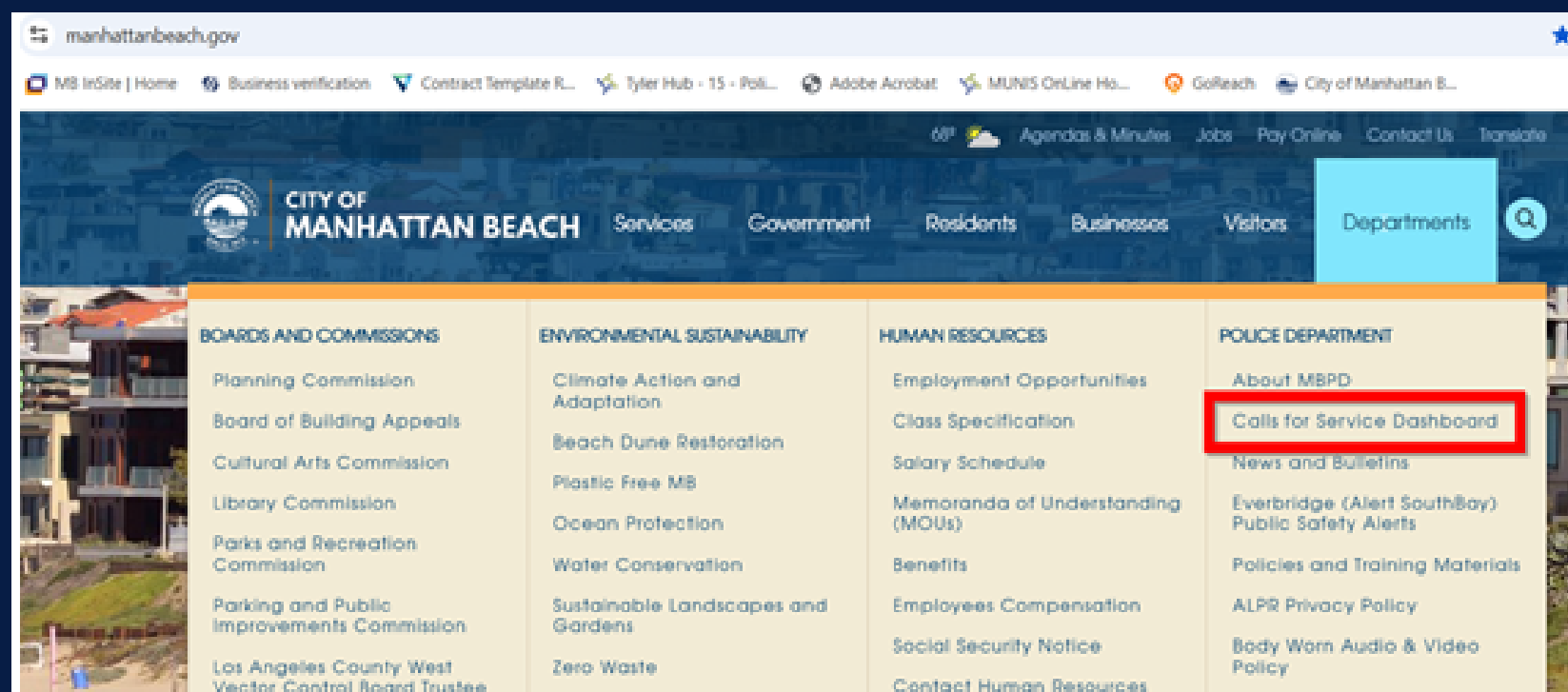
